Below are some examples of when you
should send children to school and
when to keep them home;

Send your child to school if they:

- Have a cold
- Have a headache or earache
- Are feeling sick
- Have a bad stomach
- Didn't sleep much last night
- Have a sore throat

Keep your child home if they:

- Have sickness or diarrhoea
(48 Hours)
- Have chickenpox
(Until Scabbed Over)
- Have a high temperature
(higher than 38)
- Have headlice
(Until treated)

Call the doctor if they:

- Have sickness or diarrhoea
for longer than 2 days.
- Have tonsillitis
(infected tonsils)
- Have an ear infection
(discharge from ear)

of Attendance & Wellbeing services.

How you can Help

- Have a good bedtime routine every night.
 - Make sure children are in bed early and have a good night's sleep.
- Pack school bags and make any packed lunches the night before.
- Get school uniform ready the night before.
- Set your alarm for the mornings to give you enough time to get to school.
- Limit television, computer, and tablet time before school.
- Never take holidays in term time.
- Try and make sure any dental or medical appointments are made for after school.

If your child tells you they feel unwell and you are unsure whether they need to have the day off, please send them to school. Looking after your child is very important to us and if they are truly unwell, we will contact you.

What do to if your child is ill or absent

- Please phone reception on **01443 473747** before **9:30am** and leave a message explaining the reason for your child's absence.
- If you do not let us know we will have to contact you and this is recorded on the child's attendance record.
- If you wish to take your child on holiday during term time, a holiday notification form will need to be completed and you may be issued a Fixed Penalty Notice by the Local Authority.
- Parents arriving late with pupils must sign the late book in reception, giving a reason for lateness.
- For any hospital, doctor or dental appointments during school time, please bring your appointment letter or card to school.

Why does your child need to attend school punctually and regularly?

- Good attendance and punctuality are important for children to learn and to be successful.
- Your child's social skills are also improved by regular attendance.
- Your child needs to be in school to be taught, it is important that both school and home, work in partnership to make sure Glenboi children get the best that they deserve.
- Children who regularly arrive late often miss out on valuable teacher information. They can also become embarrassed walking into a working classroom late.
- Your child will gain knowledge and information.
 - As a parent, it is your legal responsibility to ensure that your child/children come to school every day.

Children cannot learn if they are not in school.

Research shows that pupils who attend school regularly are more likely to do well in the future.
